Pastor Cosmas Mzungu and I haven't been working together long, so we started with \$100 and gave a little extra so he could buy a receipt book. After he brought the receipt, I gave him \$300. When we did the final installment, Mzungu was shocked and overwhelmed. When a preacher is left speechless, that's something!

The pastor couldn't contain his gratitude, but I told him I'm just the middle man. Pastor Mzungu and the church in Kashani lift praise and thanks to God for what He has done through Dennis and Elizabeth. Thanks to their generosity, a large portion of the debt has been eliminated.

More fun: We received a \$500 gift from **Wayne Avenue Baptist Church** in Lubbock, Texas. I sent a message to **Pastor Eddie Sutton** for guidance how to use the money, and he said we're free to do what's best. I'm an American. I like freedom. God bless Texas!

Pastor Mzungu helped chase down a resource to buy Swahili Bibles, so we bought a lot of Bibles. Pastor Julius Moti, down in Mugome, has been after me to get Bibles for his people for a long time, so Wayne Avenue BC solved the problem. We bought enough for the churches in Mugome and Kashani. Hallelujah!

Pastor Moti sent a phone video of the folks holding their Bibles and singing a "thank you" song in Swahili. That was cool. I wish it would attach to this letter. The folks at both churches are praising God and grateful for your generosity.
