We made it back to Zambia after our four month furlough. Praise the Lord that it was a good trip and we found most everything at our house in good shape in Chingola. There were a lot of things to clean and repair, but most of that has been done by now, and our luggage was only lost for a few hours. Amen!

Adamson Chabala and Kasompe Church Plant

I went to visit Pastor Adamson at the Kasompe church very soon after we arrived. His right hand that was badly burned looks deformed. It is not right. He can't really use it. But it is a Workman's Compensation case with the Mine, so there is nothing that can be done about it now. The Mine blamed the accident on him, but thankfully, a government inspector investigated and set them straight. He said the Mine was at fault due to lack of maintenance of the electrical substation that exploded. So this will probably drag on in litigation for a very long time. We hope and pray they get him the medical attention he needs. But he is in a very good spirit (attitude) and preached a great sermon this past Sunday.

Pastor Adamson told me a story about a lady who has been with the new church plant since it started last May. She came to church a few weeks ago and said here husband, George, was very sick. So after church Adamson and Mr. Sinkala went to the man's house and took George to a clinic. He was vomiting uncontrollably. The clinic referred him to a hospital for surgery because his appendix was leaking poison into his system. After his appendix was removed, Adam went to visit George in the hospital and led him to Christ. This past Sunday, was **George Mbewe's** first Sunday in our church. He looked pretty rough. He has been a heavy drinker and has been told to stop for his health's sake. Pray that George obeys and stays with us in church and grows into being a disciple for the Lord Jesus.

Mr. Sinkala showed me four or five pieces of land that we are praying about buying for the Kasompe church. The ideal one might be a bit too far from where we are meeting now. One day when the heavy rains stop I plan to go out there, Lord willing, and walk the distance myself to see how far it actually is on foot. I say it is ideal because it has all of the official paperwork in place for a purchase. It doesn't seem any of the other owners have done any paperwork at all. So those are not an option. We need something that we can take to Ministry of Lands and get a title deed within a couple of years (maximum). We don't want a "land battle" on our hands like the ones in which so many people get involved here. Please pray for us to have wisdom.

The first semester of our 2026 Bible Institute year opened on March 21st. This is the biggest group I can remember with 26 students for the two Saturday classes and 6 students for the Tuesday and Thursday classes. So we are thankful. With only 4 weeks off this year, we should finish the week before Christmas, Lord willing. We have two men on schedule to graduate this year, Lord willing. Thank you for all that you do for us to pray for us and provide for us financially. God bless! Amen!
