Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

**February - March 2022**

February 27 marked our four year anniversary of arriving in Brazil. The four years have had its shares of ups and downs, but through it all, God has been so faithful. I have to admit that when I tried to think and plan for the different difficulties that we would face, I didn't factor in a worldwide pandemic. I knew that there would be difficulties in starting a church in a foreign land, but social distancing, hand sanitizer, and masks were not difficulties that I planned on. We are very thankful that after two years, the mask restriction has finally been dropped in our city with the exception of hospitals and public transportation. I have tried to refrain from mentioning Covid as much as possible during my prayer letters, but I would like to thank all of our supporting churches who faithfully took care of us the entire time. I am very grateful for faithful Christians who we can count on to hold the ropes for us while we serve here in Brazil.

One difficulty we had to deal with last month was, arriving at church on a Wednesday night, only to discover that some of the electric wiring had been stolen. We moved the service to our house for that night and were able to have it repaired in time for Sunday. A few weeks later the wiring was stolen again which forced us to do an entire service in the dark, except for a few cell phone flashlights. The only positive note was a policeman in my church informed me that they were able to catch the guy after the second time. Hopefully, we don't have any more problems with that.

I was privileged to lead a young man to the Lord named Vitor a few weeks ago. Most of time when you are witnessing you are either planting or watering the seed. However, every once in a while, God allows you to reap some easy fruit. Vitor's heart had already been prepared by the Holy Spirit and he readily accepted Christ after listening to me present the gospel to him.

I was also able to make a visit recently to man named Ritemar. Another Christian asked me to make a visit with him and warned me that he was Jehovah's Witness. I spent that afternoon trying to brush up on my knowledge of how to deal with that particular heresy. Thankfully, he was not a dedicated Jehovah's Witness and after an hour or so, he knelt down and received Jesus Christ as his Savior.

It is always a blessing to see people like Ritemar and Vitor respond correctly when presented with truth. A few weeks ago we had a first time visitor to church who confidently informed me before the service that he was going to start attending regularly. About fifteen minutes into the message he got up and walked out in the middle of the service, and we haven't seen him since. This makes me very thankful for the faithful church members the Lord has given us who have a love for the truth of the bible.

I would appreciate prayer for a project that I am going to be doing on April 29. A language school in Pouso Alegre is hosting me to do an American style grill out for some of their English students. The following Friday, I will hopefully be doing the same thing here in Itajuba. I am praying that the Lord will use this to help me develop more contacts in our city. If these first experiences go well, I could possibly get into several more language schools in our city. Projects like this don't necessarily mean someone getting saved immediately, but they have great potential for developing relationships and opening doors for later.
