Dear Partners in the Ministry,

What a blessing it has been to see the Lord answer prayers and allow us to accomplish so much this past month. As I mentioned in our last update, missionary friends from Zimbabwe joined us for a couple of weeks as we held our final village Bible school for the year and launched a new outreach program in the village.

For our Bible school, we taught a module class on Missions, which was an encouraging reminder that missions does not stop with us. Just as others have reached us with the gospel, we should be reaching others as well.

Following our Bible school, we launched a new village market outreach program. Once a month, we travel to different village markets near local churches where we already have a connection with the national pastor. There, we hold open-air preaching, distribute gospel tracts, and set up a table where people can publicly ask Bible questions that we answer for everyone to hear. This month, four pastors who attended the Bible school joined us, along with three of our young men from our city church. It was a great blessing to see them excited to share the gospel with their own people and put into practice what was taught in Bible School.

On the day of the market outreach, one of the pastors asked if I would visit a village where he recently started a Bible study. A couple of former witch doctors had trusted Christ, and he wanted me to meet with them. We drove out and met on the dirt floor of a small brick house with two former witch-doctor ladies and several of their children and grandchildren. I was able to go through the gospel with them, making sure they fully understood what it means to be born again, and praise the Lord—we saw the granddaughter of one of the former witch doctors trust Christ. Please pray for these women and for the national pastor who is discipling them and working toward planting a church in that village.

Another program we were able to start this month is a Wednesday night youth gathering at our home for our church in the city. Every Wednesday evening, we open our house for the teens and their friends to come over for snacks, games, singing, and discussions on spiritual topics.

Another praise is that we have also seen a couple other men in the city trust Christ and it's encouraging to see them excited about serving the Lord.

During this month, while our guests were here, we had the opportunity to drive a couple hours up to Mfuwe to visit a national game park. We had a wonderful time. However, on two separate occasions, monkeys jumped into our truck and stole handfuls of chocolate-chip muffins! There is never a dull moment here in Zambia.
